Description:

Gulf University's graduation numbers have remained stable and diverse across disciplines over the past three academic years (2023–2024 to 2025–2026), with an average of approximately 206 graduates per year across five academic programs, reflecting the university's consistent institutional scale and academic performance. Graduate output ranged from a high of 222 in 2023–2024 to a low of 191 in 2024–2025, before recovering to 206 in 2025–2026 — a pattern consistent with steady-state enrollment rather than volatile swings. The introduction of the Law program in 2024–2025, which produced 10 graduates in its first tracked year and grew to 12 in 2025–2026, demonstrates a strategic expansion aligned with Bahrain's Vision 2030, enhancing the university's academic portfolio and societal contribution. Programs such as Human Resource Management — consistently the university's largest graduating cohort (114, 91, and 101 graduates across the three years respectively) — and Mass Communication, both of which attract a significant number of female students, further strengthen Gulf University's contribution to Sustainable Development Goal 5 (Gender Equality).

Overall, these trends indicate sustainable academic growth, program diversification, and consistent student throughput, positioning Gulf University as a steadily advancing institution committed to inclusive and quality higher education.
