GU and Ram Medical Center Discuss Potential Collaboration

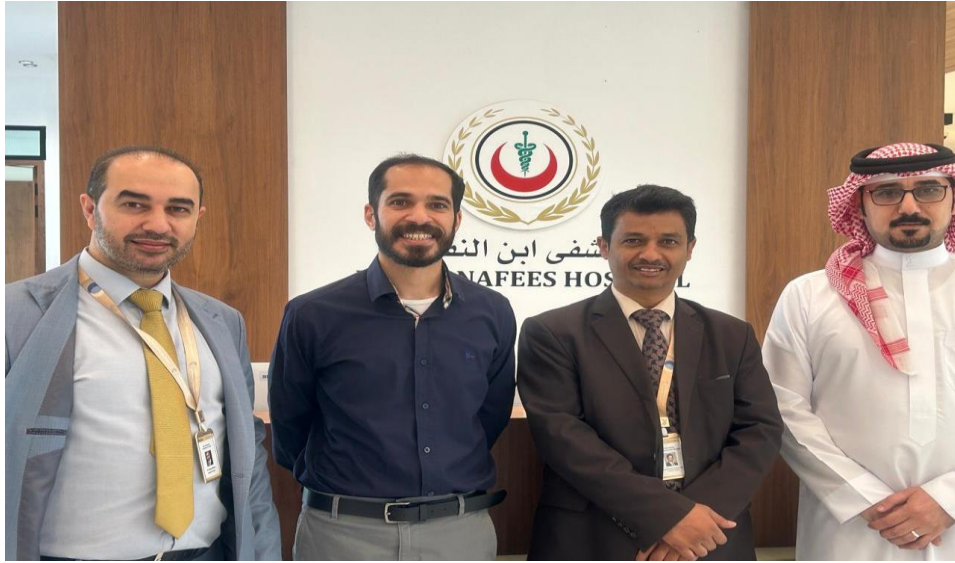

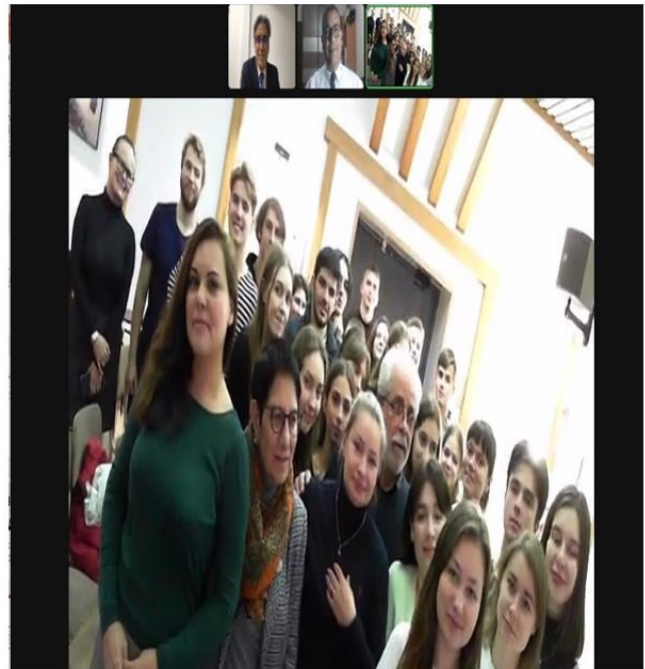
SOCIAL ENGAGEMENT

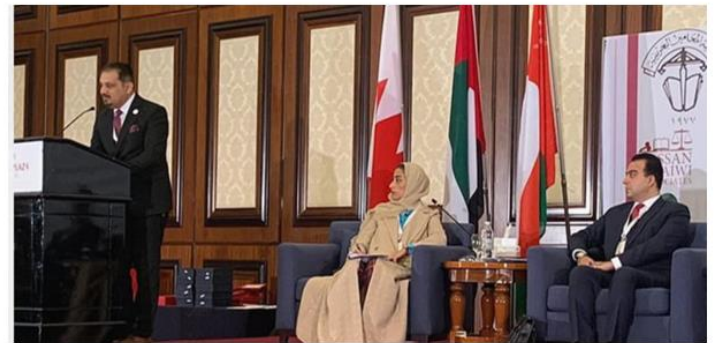
