Bahraini Women Day






Sports Day










Lecture at St Petersburg University, Russia

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

Figure 3: Sustainability and Development Makers Center at Gulf University: Core Mission Implementation




Figure 4: Sustainability and Development Makers Center at Gulf University: Initiatives for Local/Regional/International Collaborative Projects.

The Approach...

An innovative space with multidisciplinary and collaborative work environments, formal and informal experiential learning environments to co-think, co-create and co-develop initiatives, actions and alternatives in alignment with university vision towards Lifelong Learning and Sustainable Development Goals. Sustainable Engineering Hub Project is developed via a collaborative work involving both engineering staff and students. The design development considers a 3Rs approach where overall project components, structures and materials promote a life cycle extension process, aligned with university initiatives for climate actions. The progression of the designed environment with recycled shipping containers supports a well-established real-life observation for campus habitants, raising their awareness towards sustainable development and the role of community engagement in a higher education institution, revealing how small actions can lead to big changes....

The Development Process...


The design of the Sustainable Engineering Hub refers a well-established process where both predesign development phase and design development phase were considered with reference to relevant conceptual and technical approaches in regard of the architectural reuse of shipping containers to create living, working and studying environments. Additionally, within the pre-

design phase, range of environmental and life cycle studies were deployed with reference to international similar projects in the context of Higher Education institutions or other applications and contexts. The design development examined such trendy sustainable solutions in terms of feasibility and viability to initiate designing the Hub Project using five 40ft old shipping containers, exploring all functional and aesthetic alternatives with a focus on their environmental aspects, qualities and impact on campus habitants experience, thinking and awareness towards sustainability... As a way to think globally and act locally...

4.3. SDM-C GU Sustainability Week Project:

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4.4. SDM-C: In-Progress Initiatives, Actions and Projects proposed by the Center's Members: Designed initiative for Project Inputs "GU Commitments Towards SDGs"

1.Environment:

- Campus Green Initiative: Develop a campus-wide initiative to plant native trees and plants, which can help reduce carbon emissions and increase biodiversity. This could also include creating a campus garden, where students can learn about sustainable agriculture and organic farming.
- Recycling and Composting Program: Implement a comprehensive recycling and composting program on campus, with clearly marked bins in all buildings. Offer workshops or classes on waste reduction and the importance of recycling and composting.
- Grow a Campus Garden: Students can come together to plant fresh food for the surrounding community and each student responsible on his/her plant and take care. It's a great way to reduce emissions from food transportation. Plus, students can learn about growing food in an urban setting, preparing them for life after university.

2. Energy-Efficiency:

- Energy Audit and Retrofitting: Conduct an energy audit of all campus buildings and then create a plan for retrofitting old, inefficient buildings with more energy-efficient technologies. This could include installing solar panels, LED lighting, and energy-efficient appliances.
- Green Transportation Initiative: Encourage students to use more sustainable transportation methods by providing bike racks, promoting carpooling, and offering discounts or incentives for using public transportation.
- Invest in Clean Energy: Investing in clean energy is an excellent way for campus to go green. Although clean energy such as solar power and wind power have been becoming more popular, many buildings on college campuses still rely on nonrenewable energy sources for heating and cooling, electricity and other power needs. Campus can easily invest in solar energy and can place solar panels on the rooftops of buildings or even create a solar field off-campus as an energy source.

3. Education:

- Sustainability Curriculum: Develop a sustainability-focused curriculum that can be integrated into all areas of study. This could include courses on climate change, renewable energy, sustainable agriculture, and green building practices.
- Guest Lecture Series: Organize a lecture series featuring experts in sustainability, renewable energy, and other related fields. This could help raise awareness and educate students on these important issues.

4.Research:
