
Mission

CECEC Performance Summary 2024-2025

In the academic year 2024–2025, the Community Engagement and Continuing Education Center (CECEC) at Gulf University implemented a total of 226 community-based activities across its seven strategic pillars, achieving a commendable overall completion rate of approximately 75%.

- High-performing pillars Pillars 2, 3, 4, and 6 achieved 100% completion, delivering initiatives in donations, facility access, social outreach, and community service.
- Pillar 1 led in scale, executing 88 specialized training workshops, aligned with national capacity-building needs and SDG 4.
- Pillars 5 and 7, while demonstrating strong intent and progress, achieved 23% and 70% respectively due to structural and approval-related timelines.


Note on Partial Progress:

The performance of Pillar 5: Industry Collaboration & Consultation and Pillar 7: Continuing Education was affected by factors beyond CECEC's immediate control:

- Formal partnerships and MoUs require extended coordination, legal review, and external approvals from bodies such as the Higher Education Council (HEC).
- Several initiatives were initiated late in the academic year and remain in progress or awaiting endorsement, and are expected to be fully realized in the 2025–2026 cycle.
- CECEC has put mechanisms in place to ensure follow-up, documentation, and reporting on these ongoing partnerships and long-term engagements.




Executive Summary -Academic Year 2024–2025

The Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) at Gulf University has demonstrated significant advancement in executing its strategic initiatives for the academic year 2024–2025. Aligned with national priorities and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), CECEC's programs emphasized societal impact, innovation, sustainability, and inclusive participation. This report summarizes performance across seven key pillars, each reinforcing Gulf University's commitment to transformative community engagement.


Pillar 1: Training Workshop Sessions

CECEC organized a total of 130 training workshops, including 88 unpaid and 42 paid sessions. Notable partnerships included the Ministry of Housing, Ministry of Works, Ministry of Interior, and Bahrain Reads. Despite the low attendance in paid sessions, the unpaid sessions had high implementation success. This pillar directly supported SDG 4 – Quality Education and fully met Objective OB16.IN01, addressing specialized training needs in the community.




Pillar 2: Donations (Gifts and Equipment)

CECEC facilitated the donation of over 1,693 items, including computers, printers, CGM sensors, chairs, plants, meals, paintings, and theses to schools, NGOs, and health institutions. These efforts advanced multiple SDGs – 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 13, and 17—achieving a 90% execution rate under Objective OB14.IN02, supporting sustainable education and welfare services.




Pillar 3: Resources, Materials, and Facilities

The university extended its facilities and media studios 11 times to external beneficiaries, such as schools and associations, enabling enriched learning experiences and community events. This initiative fulfilled 100% of its target, supporting SDGs 4 and 9, and fulfilling Objective OB16.IN03 to enhance access to GU's physical and media infrastructure.




Pillar 4: Social Engagement

A total of 13 events were conducted, including World Diabetes Day, Earth Hour, International Children's Day, and tree-planting campaigns, as well as inclusive activities with organizations like Kiswa Bahrain. This pillar promoted SDGs 3, 4, 13, 16, and 17 and reflects a 90% implementation rate in line with Objective OB14.IN02, reinforcing GU's cultural, environmental, and health engagement efforts.




Pillar 5: Industry Relations, Collaboration, and Consultation CECEC initiated 31 collaborative engagements with public and private sector entities including Al-Hekma Retired Society, Alsalam Hospital, Osus Legal Firm, RHF, Al-Jishi Group, and ASRY. These initiatives supported SDGs 3, 4, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 17 and demonstrated 90% progress toward Objective OB13.IN01, targeting industrial innovation and societal benefit.



Pillar 6: Community Services

A diverse portfolio of 60 initiatives was implemented, ranging from student hospital visits, environmental clean-ups, public lectures, to national loyalty programs and newspaper contributions. This effort fully met its goal with 100% achievement, aligning with SDGs 3, 4, 5, 13, and 17, and satisfying Objective OB16.IN02 for broad-based community involvement.



Pillar 7: Continuing Education Programs




During AY 2024–2025, the CECEC developed and launched six continuing education initiatives aimed at promoting lifelong learning, digital skills, cross-cultural exchange, and entrepreneurial development. Key programs included the Arabic Language and Culture Program for Russian Students, Artificial Intelligence Training Workshops, and lifelong learning workshops in collaboration with Al Falah Schools.

While some initiatives are still pending final approvals from partner organizations, the unit recorded 50% progress on Objective OB21.IN03 – *Activating incubator services to support community initiatives*. This progress reflects strong foundational work in areas of education, innovation, and economic empowerment.

Linked Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):

- SDG 4 Quality Education: Enabling access to lifelong learning and language acquisition.
- SDG 8 Decent Work and Economic Growth: Fostering entrepreneurship and employability through training and incubation.
- SDG 9 Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure: Promoting technological skills through AI programs.
- SDG 10 Reduced Inequalities: Facilitating inclusive, cross-cultural education (e.g., programs for non-Arabic speakers).
- SDG 17 Partnerships for the Goals: Collaborating with local and international institutions to deliver educational programs.

These continuing education efforts underscore Gulf University's expanding role in advancing community knowledge, workforce readiness, and sustainable partnerships across diverse sectors.




Progress Summary of CECEC Strategic Objectives

Academic Year 2024–2025

As part of its strategic commitment to community engagement, the Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) at Gulf University monitored progress across 13 key operational objectives aligned with national development priorities and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The review of the 2024–2025 operational plan revealed the following:

- 12 out of 13 objectives achieved full completion (100%), covering areas such as training services, public awareness, facility accessibility, legal and industrial consultations, digital media outreach, environmental sustainability, and SDG-based initiatives.
- Objective OB21.IN03 (Activate incubator services for community initiatives) recorded 70% progress, reflecting ongoing implementation and groundwork for entrepreneurial development in future cycles.
- Objective OB14.IN03 (Forming a community advisory board) remains in progress at 0%, with activities scheduled to commence in the next academic year.

This high completion rate reflects CECEC's effective planning and execution, reaffirming Gulf University's position as a national leader in sustainable, impactful community engagement. Continuous improvement efforts will focus on advancing incubator services and launching the advisory board to further institutionalize community-driven development.



CECEC Pillar Achievement Summary – 2024–2025

The seven strategic pillars of the Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) reflect Gulf University's commitment to impactful, sustainable, and inclusive community development. Their alignment with the university's operational objectives and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) reinforces CECEC's leadership in social engagement.

Pillar 1: Training Workshop Sessions – 100% Achievement

Delivered 130 workshops (88 unpaid, 42 paid/announced) in partnership with the Ministry of Housing, Ministry of Works, Ministry of Interior, and national events. Fully met Objective OB16.IN01 and contributed to SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 17 (Partnerships), and SDG 16 (Institutions).

Pillar 2: Donations (Gifts and Equipment) – 100% Achievement

Distributed over 1,693 donated items to schools, health institutions, and charities—including IT tools, medical sensors, art, plants, meals, and books. Achieved OB14.IN02 and supported SDGs 2, 3, 4, 10, 11, 13, 17.

Pillar 3: Resources, Materials, and Facilities – 100% Achievement

Enabled 11 instances of external access to GU's halls, media studios, and campus for school-based events and NGOs. This pillar fulfilled OB16.IN03, contributing to SDG 4 (access to education), SDG 9 (infrastructure), and SDG 11 (inclusive spaces).

Pillar 4: Social Engagement – 100% Achievement

Conducted 13 large-scale engagement events including health awareness, environmental campaigns, peace celebrations, and cultural diversity days. Fully met OB14.IN02 and supported SDGs 3, 4, 10, 12, 13, 16, 17.

Pillar 5: Industry Relations, Collaboration, and Consultation – 100% Achievement (updated)

Out of 31 initiated partnerships, CECEC formally completed key collaborations (e.g., ASRY, Al-Jishi, RHF), fulfilling the annual requirement for at least 3 enhancements in OB13.IN01. Legal consultation for startups also achieved OB13.IN02. Supported SDGs 4, 8, 9, 11, 16, 17.

Pillar 6: Community Services – 100% Achievement

Delivered 60 impactful community initiatives—ranging from hospital visits and environmental talks to public media contributions and seminars. Achieved OB16.IN02 and OB16.IN04, supporting SDGs 3, 4, 5, 10, 13, 16, 17.

Pillar 7: Continuing Education Programs – 70% Achievement (updated)


Six programs developed; three implemented (e.g., AI training, Russian-Arabic exchange), with others pending partner approval. This reflects 70% progress on OB21.IN03, aligned with SDGs 4, 8, 9, 10, 17.

SDG Activity Distribution Summary – AY 2024–2025


During the academic year 2024–2025, Gulf University's Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) implemented over 130 activities, many of which


contributed to multiple Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). A comprehensive analysis of these activities revealed strong alignment with **11 out of the 17 SDGs**, reinforcing the university's commitment to inclusive, impactful, and measurable community development. The majority of activities supported:

- SDG 3 Good Health and Well-being (26%), through wellness campaigns, hospital visits, and awareness programs.
- SDG 4 Quality Education (22%), via training sessions, school programs, and lifelong learning initiatives.
- SDG 17 Partnerships for the Goals (10%), highlighting cross-sector collaborations and institutional agreements.

In addition, consistent efforts were made toward SDGs 9, 10, 13, and 16 (each at 6%), reflecting the center's focus on innovation, equality, climate action, and peacebuilding. Though smaller in share, activities supporting SDGs 2, 5, 8, and 11 also added meaningful diversity to the university's engagement portfolio.

This distribution underscores CECEC's role in advancing Bahrain's Vision 2030 and the UN 2030 Agenda, by embedding sustainability into its outreach, collaboration, and educational strategies.



Overview and Summary

The Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) successfully delivered a total of **88 training workshops** during the academic year 2024–2025. These sessions targeted a wide range of beneficiaries, including government entities and the general public. The programs reflect CECEC's strategic objective to extend specialized and technical services to the community, in line with Objective **OB16.IN01**.

Notable collaborations included the Ministry of Housing, Ministry of Works, and Ministry of Interior. This pillar supported **SDG 4 – Quality Education**, with a **100% progress rate** aligned with Objective OB16.IN01, addressing community training needs through specialized and technical offerings.



Key Partnerships and Beneficiaries

- **Ministry of Housing** 17 workshops (Completed)
- Ministry of Works 17 workshops (Completed), with 8 additional courses scheduled for next year
- **Ministry of Interior (Open Prisons & Alternative Penalties)** 37 workshops (Completed)
- **Qulf University's "Bahrain Reads" Campaign** 6 workshops
- 🖀 Hamza Alziat Center 2 delivered; 2 remaining
- Paid Public Workshops Over 41 workshops were announced and published on the website; however, most of them did not take place due to low public attendance. These were paid courses offered at very low fees. In the coming year, we plan to boost visibility, enhance public interest, and increase the number of conducted workshops through stronger marketing and outreach strategies.

Performance Highlights


- **Achievement Rate:** The overall performance of this pillar is strong, with **100% completion** of government-related training activities.
- **Diversity of Content:** Workshops covered themes such as artificial intelligence, public speaking, project management, digital design, financial planning, and legal education.
- **Delivery Method:** Sessions were held both on-campus and on-site, leveraging Gulf University's academic expertise.
- **Public Access:** Despite the launch of 41 paid training workshops for the public (promoted through posters and the university's website), **attendance remained low**, highlighting an area for strategic improvement.

Recommendations for Enhancement

- Strengthen marketing and outreach strategies to promote paid sessions more effectively.
- Consider **timing adjustments** and **topic alignment** based on audience demand.
- Enhance visibility through social media campaigns, short video clips, and community influencers.


Training Workshops: Public Engagement through Paid Sessions

As part of CECEC's commitment to community development and continuous learning, the Centre launched over 41 paid training workshops targeting the general public. These sessions were offered at very low and accessible fees to encourage wide participation. A variety of multidisciplinary topics were covered, ranging from digital skills and business essentials to creative and social development areas.

To promote these initiatives, CECEC actively published **trainer profiles and promotional posters** through the university's official website and social media platforms. Despite this proactive outreach, the majority of sessions **did not receive sufficient attendance**, and many remain **under process** as of this reporting period.

This trend highlights the need for **enhanced marketing strategies**, stronger community engagement, and perhaps revised scheduling or topic selection to increase future participation. Below are examples of posters that were published as part of the campaign.







Ministry of Housing – 2024–2025 Objective:

This outlines the training programs delivered to the Ministry of Housing as part of Gulf University's ongoing collaboration to enhance employee competencies, leadership, and technical skills in alignment with national development goals.

Overview:

A total of **17 training programs** were successfully offered in both **in-person** and **online** formats, spanning **April 2024 to June 2025**. The workshops targeted a wide range of competencies across managerial, technical, administrative, and personal development areas.

These training sessions were delivered by a qualified pool of Gulf University faculty and professional trainers. They covered **multidisciplinary topics**, including soft skills, project management, artificial intelligence, accounting, and emotional intelligence.

All training sessions were:

- Delivered in Arabic and English depending on audience needs.
- Accompanied by **certificates of participation**.
- Promoted via internal platforms and posters (see appendix).
- Designed to foster practical skills with a strong focus on interactive learning.

Summary of Trainee Feedback – Ministry of Housing

As part of the CECEC's efforts to document and enhance training quality, detailed feedback was collected from participants of a training course delivered to staff from the Ministry of Housing. The images included in this report represent summarized feedback across five key areas:

- Level of Effort:
 75% of participants rated their effort as *Excellent*, while 25% rated it as *Very Good*.
- 2. Contribution to Learning: The course had a strong impact on participants' learning. Most rated their skill level improvement and course contribution as *Excellent*, with a few indicating *Very Good*.
- 3. Instructor's Skill and Responsiveness:
 All responses reflected a high level of satisfaction with the instructor's presentation skills, responsiveness, and clarity, with the majority selecting *Strongly Agree*.
- 4. Course Content:

 The course content was generally well-received. While most respondents strongly agreed it was organized and relevant, a few suggested improvements to the workload balance and hands-on application.
- 5. Reasons for Joining:75% of participants chose the course out of personal interest, while 25% selected it due to timing.

6. Open Comments:

Participants valued the critical thinking skills taught and the trainer's clarity despite time constraints. Some suggested making the workshop more interactive and hands-on, ideally delivered in person.

This feedback has been archived on SharePoint for documentation and quality assurance and will be used to enhance the design of future CECEC training programs.







As part of its strategic engagement in national literacy and education initiatives, Gulf University, through the Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC),

proudly participated in the "Bahrain Reads" campaign. This initiative is in alignment with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4): Quality Education, and supports Objective OB16.IN01 of CECEC – Continue offering addressed training needs and services to the community in areas of its expertise.

Summary of Contribution

A select group of Gulf University's distinguished faculty members led **six specialized workshops** during the campaign. These sessions were designed to develop essential reading and writing skills across various age groups in the community. The workshops included interactive activities and practical strategies to foster comprehension, creativity, and confidence in written expression.

This participation reflects Gulf University's firm commitment to supporting academic development and contributing to the broader mission of literacy promotion in the Kingdom of Bahrain. Through these efforts, CECEC continues to serve as a bridge between academic expertise and community empowerment.



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Summary of Trainee Feedback – Ministry of Works (One Course Sample)

As part of the CECEC's efforts to document and enhance training quality, detailed feedback was collected from participants of one selected training course delivered to staff from the Ministry of Works.

The images included in this report summarize the feedback across five key areas: Level of Effort:

The majority of participants rated their effort as Excellent, followed by Very Good, and a few marking it as Satisfactory.

Contribution to Learning:

The course was impactful in enhancing participants' skills. Most rated their skill level improvement and the course's contribution to their professional development as Excellent, with some indicating Very Good or Satisfactory.

Instructor's Skill and Responsiveness:

Participants expressed high satisfaction with the trainer's presentation, interaction, and responsiveness. The majority selected Strongly Agree for all evaluated aspects.

Course Content:

The course content was rated as clear, well-organized, and relevant. While most participants strongly agreed with the structure and delivery, a few suggested including more applied, hands-on content.

Reasons for Joining:

A large portion (82.8%) of participants joined the course out of personal interest, while others cited convenient timing or professional development needs.

Open Comments:

Participants highlighted that they benefited most from:

- Dashboard creation
- Presenting and linking data effectively
- Using Excel skills to support decision-making and reporting

Some suggested future versions of the course include advanced topics or tailored content for IT professionals.





Open Prisons and Alternative Penalty Workshops Ministry of Interior – Bahrain

In support of the Kingdom of Bahrain's efforts to enhance rehabilitation, reintegration, and alternative sentencing frameworks, the Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) at Gulf University collaborated with the **Ministry of Interior**

to design and deliver a comprehensive training initiative targeting staff of the **Open Prisons and Alternative Penalties Department**.

As of March 2025, CECEC has delivered **37 diverse workshops**, each aimed at building knowledge, practical skills, and community integration capabilities among personnel and targeted participants. The workshops spanned a wide range of domains including **financial literacy**, **project creation**, **legal systems**, **media skills**, **leadership**, **emotional intelligence**, **and AI in design**.

All training programs were delivered **free of charge**, either by Gulf University faculty or certified experts.

Summary of Trainee Feedback – Ministry of Interior: Open Prisons and Alternative Penalty Workshops

As part of the CECEC's continuous quality assurance and impact assessment, feedback was collected from participants of the training workshops focused on Open Prisons and Alternative Penalty frameworks. These sessions were designed to align with Bahrain's vision for modern, human-centered rehabilitation systems and justice reform.

Level of Effort

Most participants (over 50%) reported putting in **Excellent** effort, while a significant portion rated themselves as **Very Good**. This indicates high participant engagement and interest in the course content.

Contribution to Learning

Participants showed strong improvement in their knowledge levels between the start and end of the course. Most responses indicated an **Excellent** increase in understanding related to sustainable justice concepts, open prison systems, and alternative sentencing mechanisms.

Instructor's Skill and Responsiveness

The trainer received **strongly positive ratings**, with many respondents indicating "Strongly Agree" on indicators such as clarity, presentation style, engagement, and openness to questions.

Course Content

The course content was generally viewed as **well-structured**, **relevant**, **and informative**. Several participants appreciated the clarity of the learning objectives, the organized content, and the practical focus of the sessions.

Reasons for Joining

Participants had a mix of motivations:

- 44% joined out of personal interest,
- 33% due to degree/professional requirements,
- 22% selected the course because of its **suitable timing**.

Open Comments – What Was Most Valuable?

- Many responses reflected appreciation for learning new concepts related to sustainability and global frameworks.
- Highlights included:
 - "Understanding the 17 SDG goals,"
 - "Linking sustainable development with justice,"
 - "Real-world application in Bahrain's vision."

Suggestions for Improvement

While many said the course was already good, several suggestions were offered:

- Enhance interactivity and engagement with real-world local case studies.
- Consider extending duration or offering a follow-up session to cover in-depth applications.
- Strengthen digital delivery methods where relevant.

Through proactive communication and health education, Gulf University continues to play an active role in supporting national health campaigns and enhancing community resilience against vector-borne diseases.







Gulf University Develops AI-Based Fuzzy Logic System for Diabetes Risk Prediction Linked Pillar:

Gulf University continues to make impactful contributions to healthcare innovation with the development of an AI-Based Fuzzy Logic System for Precision Diabetes Risk Prediction. This initiative was led by Dr. Walid El Fezzani, Head of the Electrical and Electronics Engineering

Department, in collaboration with the University of Northampton (UK) and the Sustainability and Development Makers Center at Gulf University, under the supervision of Dr. Omar Blibech.

The system employs Artificial Intelligence and fuzzy logic to predict the risk of developing diabetes based on a set of personal health indicators including body weight, family history, age, and lifestyle habits. It is designed to support individuals in understanding their risk category (low, medium, or high) and taking preventive steps. The model has demonstrated an impressive accuracy rate of 87%, making it a reliable tool for early intervention.

The project contributes to public health awareness, diabetes prevention, and proactive disease management—issues that align with the global and national health priorities. The innovation has been widely shared through national media and professional engineering forums, such as the Bahrain Society of Engineers' "Almohandis" magazine (Issue 80), highlighting its relevance and societal value.



Al-Based Fuzzy Logic System for Precision Diabetes Risk Prediction

Dr. Walid EL FEZZANI, Head of the Electrical and Electronics Engineering Department at Gulf University, in collaboration with the University of Northampton in UK and the Sustainability and Development Makers Center at Gulf University, directed by Dr. Omar BLIBECH, has developed an Al-powered system to predict the risk of developing diabetes. This new system could transform

healthcare by helping people understand their risk of diabetes early and take steps to prevent it.

Diabetes is a growing global health problem that affects more than 500 million people worldwide. Early detection is crucial, but it's often challenging because the risk factors—like body weight, family history, and lifestyle habits—are complex

and can vary greatly from person to person. This new Al system tackles that challenge by analyzing a variety of personal health factors to provide a personalized diabetes risk score. It can tell someone whether they are at low, medium, or high risk of developing the disease, with an impressive accuracy rate of 87%. Using artificial intelligence (AI) and a system known as

AI System Featured in National Media to Raise Diabetes Awareness Linked Objective:

As part of Gulf University's ongoing efforts to improve community health awareness, the AI-Based Diabetes Risk Prediction System was prominently featured in local Arabic media. The article, published in a national newspaper, presented the project's objectives and real-life applications in monitoring diabetes risks using AI-powered technology.

Dr. Walid El Fezzani, Head of the Electrical and Electronics Engineering Department, explained how the system helps predict the probability of developing diabetes based on eight key factors, including age, weight, family history, and lifestyle. The media coverage emphasized the system's 87% accuracy and the importance of early detection in combating chronic illnesses.

This outreach effort supported the university's community engagement goals, helping to educate the public on diabetes prevention and encouraging healthier lifestyle choices.











Summary of Participant Feedback









Summary of Participant Feedback




How satisfied were you with the event? ؟ ما مدى رضاك عن الفعالية ؟ 61 responses




How relevant and helpful do you think it was for your job? إلى أي مدى تعتقد أنه مناسب ومفيد لعملك؟ \$1 responses




ما مدى رضاك عن الخدمات اللوجستية؟ ?How satisfied were you with the logistics



Additional feedback on logistics تعليقات إضافية على الخدمات اللوجستية 61 responses




ما هي الجلسات التي وجدتها أكثر أهمية؟ ؟Which sessions did you find most relevant





Gulf University has significantly advanced its continuing education mission through the successful launch of four dynamic programs: the Russian Language Center, AI skills development workshops, cultural training sessions, and partial implementation of lifelong learning with AI Falah Schools. Two additional programs—an Arabic language exchange and entrepreneurship training with the Royal Humanitarian Foundation—are currently pending external approvals. This pillar demonstrates the university's growing role as a hub for inclusive learning and community-centered education, aligned with national priorities and global development goals.
