
Seven of these collaborations were successfully completed and reached 100% achievement, including:

 - Discounted rates on medical treatments and consultations


Speaking at the signing ceremony, Prof. Mohanad AlFiras, President of Gulf University, emphasized the strategic importance of this collaboration, stating:

ARDUINO Training Workshop Delivered to Alfalah School Students

As part of its outreach to foster technological skills among school students, Gulf University hosted a hands-on Arduino training workshop for students from Alfalah School, delivered by Dr. Walid Al Dulaimi, a faculty member from the College of Engineering.

The workshop introduced students to the fundamentals of electronic circuits, coding, and automation using Arduino microcontrollers—one of the most widely used platforms in STEM education and innovation projects. Students had the opportunity to engage in practical applications that blended creativity with real-world problem solving.

In response to a formal request submitted by Mr. Muath Alfaqeeh, attorney and private notary, and founder of Osus Law Firm, the Community Engagement and Continuing Education Centre (CECEC) at Gulf University organized a professional consultation session on 10 July 2025. The purpose was to support the firm in improving its digital outreach and developing a sustainable marketing strategy, especially considering its pro bono legal services aimed at underserved populations in Bahrain.

The session was attended by **Dr. Ahmad Alastal**, who provided consultation on financial strategies and system support, and **Dr. Adel Belal**, representing the College of Law to explore academic collaboration opportunities. The meeting was led and coordinated by **Dr. Marwan Milhem**, Director of CECEC, who facilitated the discussion and proposed a phased approach to consultation. As agreed, a **second session will be held on 13 July 2025**, focusing specifically on marketing strategy and digital branding, led by **Dr. Sidiag Bala**, Professor of Marketing.

This initiative falls under CECEC's broader community engagement strategy, aiming to provide practical academic support to emerging Bahraini institutions and professionals. It also demonstrates Gulf University's commitment to enabling access to justice, enhancing legal awareness, and promoting collaboration between academia and civil society.

The CECEC team will continue following up on this collaboration to monitor progress and provide ongoing advisory support as needed. The firm's request letter and supporting documents have been archived for reporting and impact documentation.

Gulf University participated in the Al Maraee Exhibition, held over five days starting from 27 November 2024, with full coverage by both faculty members and students. The exhibition served as a platform for showcasing innovation, where the university presented an AI-driven smart agriculture project. The innovative solution enables a plant to send a WhatsApp message to the user when the soil is dry, asking: "Would you please come water me, or should I activate the water pump myself?"

This creative project was a collaboration between the Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering and the Department of Architecture and Interior Design Engineering, demonstrating the power of teamwork, research, and interdisciplinary education. The university's presence at the exhibition reflects its strong commitment to practical innovation, environmental awareness, and community collaboration.


Summary of Academic and Non-Academic Agreements Status (2024–2025)

The university maintains a broad portfolio of agreements, confirming its extensive reach into both the academic and non-academic sectors.

The status table for Academic Agreements lists 12 partners with Approved, Signed, and Valid status, including regional institutions (University of Petra, University of Sharjah) and international partners (University of Northampton, Macromedia University). The pipeline remains strong, with high-profile entities such as the Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO) pending completion of signing procedures.

The Non-Academic portfolio is even more extensive, listing 29 partners with Approved, Signed, and Valid status. This list confirms a risk-mitigation strategy by diversifying the partner base across all major stakeholder categories: Health (RAM Clinics), Legal/Governance (Guarantee for Legal Services, Bahrain Intellectual Property Society), Government (Ministry of Works, Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning), Industry (ASRY, Bahrain Chamber of Commerce), and Civil Society/Sports (Hope Talents, Special Olympics). This diversification ensures that partnership risk is not concentrated in any single economic or political sector.
